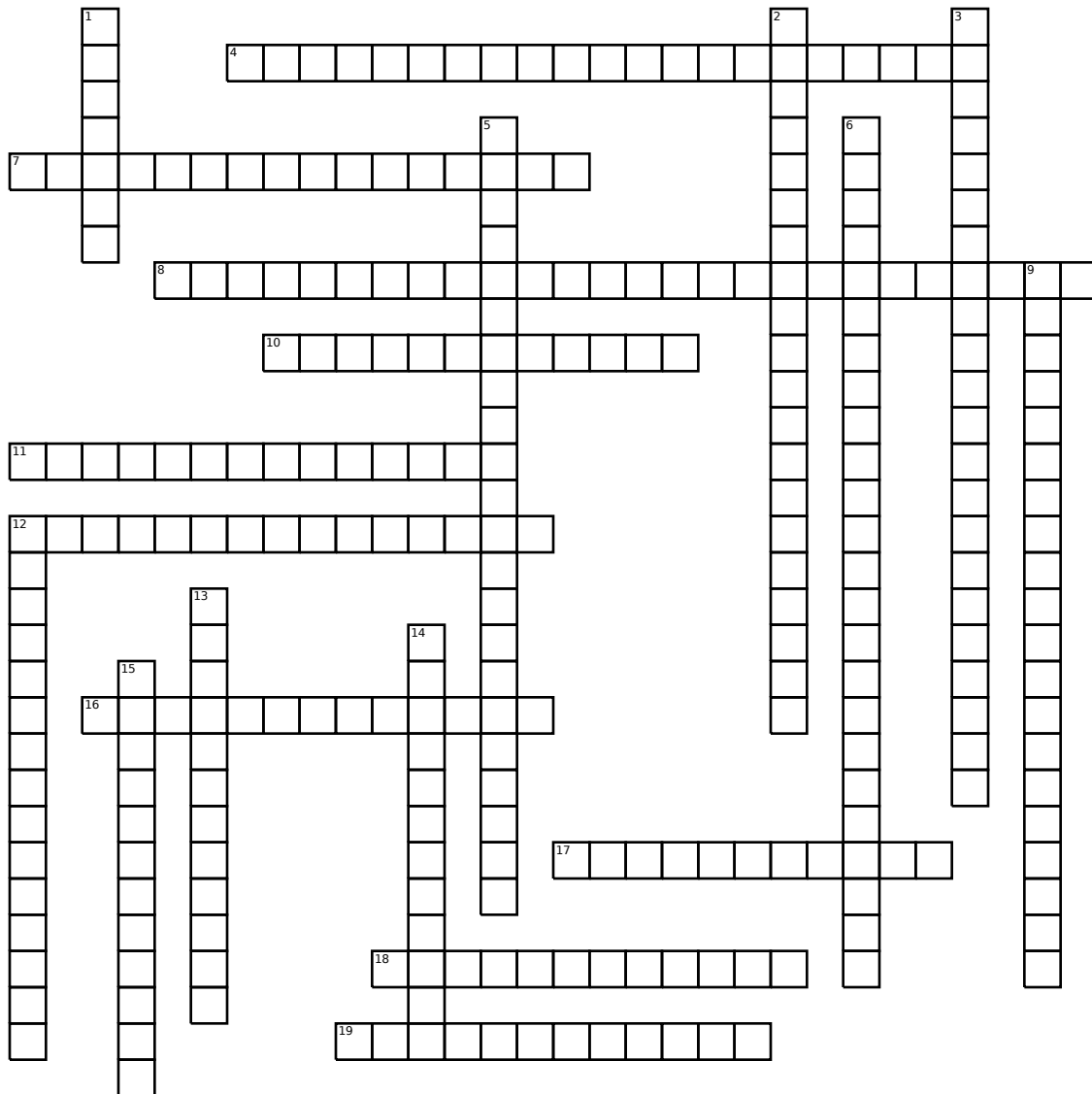

- 1 Per Jeffery Hicks, "add Support to this Switch." It instructs the command to which it is applied to run but only to display the objects that would be affected by running the command and what changes would be made to those objects.
- 2 Modifies user account control (UAC) values for an Active Directory account.
- 3 Gets one or more Active Directory domain controllers, based on discoverable services criteria, search parameters, or by providing a domain controller identifier, such as the NetBIOS name.
- 5 Moves a domain controller in AD DS to a new site.
- 6 Installs an Active Directory service account on a computer.

- 12 Changes the name of an Active Directory object.
